The Central Regional Council invites you to Viroqua for the annual gathering of Group, Branch and Initiative leaders in the Central Region as we continue to weave the vessel for the Being Anthroposophia through our co-working with one another. We are grateful to the local members of the Anthroposophical Group and the Pleasant Ridge Waldorf School for hosting us in their community. We will be surrounded by the beautiful ridges and valleys of the "driftless" area of southwestern Wisconsin where the land remained free from glacial activity. Since 2004, the Central Regional Council has been calling together a circle of our co-workers in the life of the Anthroposophical Society - representatives of Groups, Branches, and initiatives from throughout our region. Annually, we take up a theme together; meet one another in a variety of ways, invite personal renewal and out of our research together offer insights to share with our local groups. On Sunday we hold our regional annual general meeting (AGM) providing reports on past activities and vision explorations for the future. We

hope each group, branch and initiative can send two or more representatives to share in this work.

This year we take up themes surrounding the Whitsun event. Whitsun presents us with a remarkable and dramatic picture of Spirit-filled individuals anointed and enkindled with the impulse to speak out of individual freedom regarding the truth and healing power of the Spirit. The intense rush of spirit planted in the hearts of human beings highlights one of the greatest challenges of being human: placing our individual ego in right relationship within the social realm. This challenge

is present most strongly during our time in human evolution. There is greater and greater emphasis on our individuality and personal freedom. Local communities regularly consider how to respect the freedom of each person while holding a space for collaboration and generative activity in the spirit of brotherhood/sisterhood or mutuality.
