<u>Celestial</u> Occurrences


#### New Moon=NM

This is the first phase of the Moon, where the Moon is on the same side of the Earth as the Sun. More precisely, it is the instant when the Moon and the Sun have the same ecliptical longitude. The Moon is not normally visible at this time except when it is seen in silhouette during a solar eclipse.

### Full Moon=FM

This is the lunar phase that occurs when the Moon is completely illuminated as seen from the Earth. This occurs when the Moon is in opposition with the Sun (when it is on the opposite side of the Earth from the Sun; more precisely, when the ecliptic longitudes of the Sun and Moon differ by 180 degrees). This means that the hemisphere of the Moon that is facing the Earth (the near side) is almost fully illuminated by the Sun and appears round.

**Cardinal Grand Cross** are a rare astrological events when four planets are in exactly 90 degrees in aspect to one another (forming four squares and two oppositions), and in the cardinal signs which are Aries, Cancer, Libra and Capricorn.
